What's happening?

We won't finish a Language Arts unit this week as there are only 4 days, so please note the dates for the pretest and final test. We'll get back on track after Parent/Teacher conferences.

The first math test went very well. Students need to use their corrected assignments to help them see what they still need to practice to prepare for a test. We are now doing

100 multiplication facts in 2 minutes. When your child has three days in a row of 100 correct on a quiz, he or she is finished taking multiplication quizzes.

We'll be finishing the first chapter in Social Studies before conferences. This is often a difficult test for students because of the amount of material covered. It is helpful for the students to begin
